Практикум укладено відповідно до чинної програми навчальної дисципліни «Практичний курс англійської мови» для підготовки фахівців першого (бакалаврського) рівня вищої освіти спеціальності 014 Середня освіта (Мова та література (німецька)) галузі знань 01 Освіта / Педагогіка.

Пропонована розробка може слугувати додатковим матеріалом до базового підручника Upstream Intermediate для поглибленого вивчення студентами теми «Подорож розширює світогляд. Види подорожей. Труднощі під час відпочинку».

Навчальний матеріал систематизовано у шести розділах («Тематичний словник», «Сталі вирази», «Фразові дієслова», «Проблемні» лексичні одиниці», «Лексико-граматичні вправи», «Завдання для читання»), в яких подано класифікацію лексичних одиниць з увиразненої теми з метою розширення словникового запасу студентів, вправи лексико-граматичного спрямування, завдання на вживання фразових дієслів, для читання, розвитку писемного мовлення. Запропоновані вправи на встановлення відповідності, заповнення пропусків, розгадування кросворду, рольові ігри, переклад, розуміння тексту, завдання альтернативного та множинного вибору сприяють розвитку, вдосконаленню лексико-граматичних умінь, навичок студентів. Вправи комунікативного характеру розвивають навички і вміння аргументувати та відстоювати власну думку, враховувати зацікавлення співрозмовника. Матеріал посібника включає завдання на вживання фразових дієслів у типових ситуаціях іншомовного мовлення. Вправи, подані у практикумі, мають різний рівень складності, вирізняються широкою вживаністю лексико-граматичних елементів.

Представлений посібник можуть використовувати студенти ЗВО, учні старших класів спеціалізованих шкіл, гімназій, ліцеїв.

FOREWORD

The practical guide has been concluded in accordance with the current curriculum of the discipline "Course of the English Language Practice" for the first (bachelor's) level of higher education, the speciality 014 Secondary Education (Language and Literature (German)) of the field of knowledge 01 Education / Pedagogy.

The proposed practical guide can serve as supplementary material to the basic Upstream Intermediate textbook for in-depth study of the topic "Travel Broadens the Mind. Kinds of Travelling. Holiday Troubles".

The educational material is systematised into six sections ("Thematic Vocabulary", "Collocations", "Phrasal Verbs", "Confusing Vocabulary", "Lexicogrammar Exercises", "Reading Tasks"), which provide a classification of vocabulary units on the suggested topic in order to expand students' vocabulary, lexical and grammatical exercises, tasks for using phrasal verbs, reading and writing. The authors have offered matching exercises, gap-filling, crossword puzzles, role-playing games, translation, text comprehension tasks, alternative and multiple choice tasks that will definitely contribute to the development and improvement of students' lexico-grammar skills. The communicative exercises are meant to develop the speaker's skills and the ability to argue and defend one's own opinion and to take into account the interests of the interlocutor. The material in the practical guide includes various tasks on the use of phrasal verbs in typical situations of foreign language speech. The exercises presented in the practical guide are of different levels of difficulty and are characterised by a wide range of lexical and grammar elements.

This practical guide can be easily recommended for the use of the students of higher educational institutions, senior pupils of specialised schools, grammar schools and lyceums.
